Climate Action Plan Spotlight - Reduce Waste Sent to Landfill

Did You Know? Decaying material in landfills releases greenhouse gasses - accounting for 3% of the City of Easton's total emissions and nearly 10% of the City of Bethlehem's emissions. Waste also contributes to transportation emissions as a result of the trucks that haul trash to landfills.

If you're doing some spring cleaning, it can feel tempting to pile everything you want to get rid of into a trash bag, drop it on the curb, and forget about it. However, we all know that bag of trash doesn't really just disappear - it has to go somewhere (the landfill), and both on its way and once it's there it will contribute to greenhouse gas emissions.

Instead, while cleaning out your old clutter, separate out what can be recycled, what may still be usable, and what really needs to go to the landfill. Reuse is one of the best options for being more sustainable when it comes to our "stuff." Donating unwanted items to a thrift store, posting them in a "buy nothing" group or similar community, or

The Garden now includes native plants, pollinator friendly perennials, annuals, trees and the famous roses.
