STEM Outreach Club invites students to come together around events related to STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. A team of Chief Science Officers (CSOs) works together with their advisor, science teacher Dylan Fedell to connect not only fellow high school students but also elementary and middle school students in the district and the larger community to STEM topics. They host an annual STEM Night for elementary school students, participate in tree plantings, and each CSO picks a personal project to work on for the year based on their interests.

Environmental topics feature heavily in STEM Outreach Club's work. In addition to the first tree planting at Nockamixon State Park, they have planted trees at multiple municipal parks in the area in following years. Students learned about native tree species, how to select appropriate species for different planting sites, and the benefits of trees for carbon sequestration, stormwater management, and air quality. Last year, the club organized a satellite event at Palisades during the Youth Climate Summit where they tuned into some of the Youth Climate Summit presentations happening at Nurture Nature Center and participated in related activities at their school. This year, the club will attend the summit in person at NNC, and CSOs will give



- Smaller municipalities consult your township or borough's website for information on whether you have an EAC and when they meet
- All Bethlehem residents: Become a Bethlehem Climate Champion by taking the linked survey to commit to one or multiple climate actions. After completing the survey, participants can pick up their Climate Challenge yard sign from the front desk in City Hall and will have their names added to a list of Climate Champions on the challenge website.
