Partner Spotlight:

The Lehigh Valley's Sustainable Businesses

We recently opened applications for the LV Sustainable Business Recognition Program. This program celebrates business owners in the Easton and Bethlehem areas for their commitment to sustainability and climate action. Local businesses have an important role to play in implementing both cities' Climate Action Plans (CAPs) through reducing their own emissions, making more sustainable options available to their customer base, and serving as leaders modeling climate action and sustainability in their communities.







Participating businesses submit an application detailing the actions they have taken to be more sustainable in the areas of energy, water, transportation, waste, food, and community. There are 4 levels of recognition depending how far along each business is in operating sustainably. Recognized businesses receive a window decal to display their accomplishment as well as digital promotional materials. Here are some examples of the actions our participating businesses are taking. Each of these businesses is doing much more than we have the space to list here!

 Green Pond Packaging: Established a distribution company focused on sustainable, plant-based packaging and dinnerware alternative solutions. Consolidate deliveries whenever possible and select carbon neutral shipping options.

- Easton earns A- for environmental leadership, transparency from global nonprofit
- <u>'Easton achieves certification</u> through Bird Town Pennsylvania

- Nature's Way Market: Use all LED lights. Reach out to MetEd for an energy assessment. Plantings alongside the parking lot are mostly native plants, with some herbs. Installed a rain barrel. Do not buy plastic to-go bags, but reuse what customers donate.
- Primordia Mushroom Farm: Added 85 more solar panels for a grand total of 275 panels, which accounts for the majority of their electrical usage. Use electric vehicles for most deliveries and farmers' markets. Only provide paper bags at market and sell mushroom powders in compostable containers.
- The HodgePodge Croft: Installed a brand new programmable heating and cooling system. Installed a lowflow toilet. Purchase alternatives to single-use plastics that are more sustainable - ex. Biodegradable, compostable, other options.
- Zekraft: Offer accessible bike racks in front of the business
 or in the parking area for customers and employees. Offer
 an incentive or discount for customers to bring a reusable
 bag or reusable containers or mugs. Provide a hydration
 station or tap that is available to all members of the public
 during high heat days.

Climate Action Plan Spotlight -Home Energy Efficiency for Summer

Did You Know? About 3% of global emissions trace back to AC, nearly twice as much as those generated by the airline industry. (One5C, May 2025)

For many of us, summer can be the season with the highest electricity bills, primarily due to running air conditioners to stay cool. This makes it the perfect time of year to look into ways you can save money and energy. Some of the best ways to do this just involve improving efficiency - doing what you are already doing, but with less waste. You don't have to give up A/C, turn off all of your lights, or stop charging your devices. But, you can use A/C in a more targeted way, upgrade to LED lightbulbs, or consider a smart charger or power strip to avoid "phantom" or standby power use.


